Bill Addis is the author of over 100 publications on the history of building engineering, construction materials and building design. He worked for 17 years as an academic at the University of Reading and later 15 years with consulting engineers Buro Happold. He has recently been Affiliated Lecturer at the University of Cambridge, Visiting Professor at the Tor Vergata University in Rome, Guest Professor at the University of Innsbruck and is currently Visiting Professor at the University of San Sebastian.

Bill is the Chairman of the Editorial Advisory Panel for *Engineering History and Heritage* published by the Institution of Civil Engineers in London and was co-editor of *Construction History* 2011-16. In recent years he has been a member of the scientific committees for the Spanish, French, English and Portuguese national construction history congresses, and international congresses in Cambridge, Cottbus, Paris and Chicago. He is currently collaborating with the Institution of Civil Engineers to develop an information resource for engineers working on the conservation of historic civil engineering works.

His research interests include: the history of structural design; the history of iron, steel and reinforced-concrete construction; the epistemology of structural design; the use of physical models in building design; industrialization in construction.
